
## Julius Caesar A Persuasive Letter

Up until the modern era, letters were an influential form of communication. Letters are used throughout Julius Caesar to encourage action, such as the false letters Cassius writes for Brutus or the letter Artemidorus writes to warn Caesar of his impending assassination.

Imagine that you are a Roman citizen who is concerned about the current political climate in Rome. Write a letter to Brutus that encourages him to act either with or against the conspirators. The letter must use apt textual evidence from the play to support your position.
